### THE HOLY SEASON OF LENT— A Season of Grace and Mercy

Dear Parishioners, Principals, Teachers, Parents and Children, Once again, we are going to enter into the Season of Lent..... When your patience is thin, and fasting loses its meaning, remember; "Patience is power. Patience is not an absence of action; rather, it is 'timing,' it waits on the right time to act, for the right principles and in the right way." (Fulton J. Sheen)

The season of Lent is a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's resurrection at Easter. It is an opportunity for the faithful to undertake the practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving as a means to know Christ better and follow His will more faithfully.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence from meat for Catholics from the age of 18 to 59. The Church asks that, if possible, the fast on Good Friday, the "paschal fast," be continued until the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday to honour the suffering and death of Jesus and prepare more fully for His resurrection. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat from 14 to 59.

In my opinion, there is more to spiritual fasting than the above. Patience and praying for our brothers and sisters who are indifferent to us, avoiding unnecessary gossiping, and using our minds for Holy hours, tongue and mouth for more prayers are some of the easy ways to remain holy. Of course, we are weak and vulnerable, God knows that more than we do! Lent is also the time for the baptized to renew their baptismal commitment, while those who desire to become Catholics enter a process of learning and discernment, the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults, in preparation for baptism during the Easter Vigil.

As the three pillars of Lent, prayer, fasting and almsgiving are not meant to be undertaken simply to fulfill the "rules" of Lent. Prayer from the heart; fasting from those that interfere in strengthening a relationship with God, and almsgiving with compassion for those in need will make the Lenten journey a fruitful renewal period.

I wish to thank all our volunteers and all the good hearts and souls who came forward to help us during our Sacramental Celebrations. If I want to name them, this page is not enough, so, I pray for them with gratitude and thanks.

As I am going on my sick leave, please keep me in your prayers and take care of each other. Let us continue to grow in Faith, Hope and Charity.
