Dear Parishioners,

Soon after Easter, I began my Hospital Ministry and have been on call for the second week in a row with other Parish commitments. I had many Visits to John Hunter, Mater Hospital and hospice and other Local calls; standing with the sick and dying are "the Priestly Moments, and the sick and dying have a story to tell us." Those bedside stories are powerful and vibrant, and they would resonate and make me think about my life."

My heart is closely connected with all in Ukraine as I am spiritually present in their agony, which I underwent when I was a boy. It is impossible not to notice people's pain, hurt, and tears in many ways in the Hospital and in many parts of our world, in our society, elsewhere, including Sri Lanka.

Women, men, and children scurrying to hide in bomb shelters; innocent lives trapped in burned out or collapsed buildings; and abandoned and traumatized elderly people without relief amidst the senseless devastation of war and mishandling of Political Powers.

Moreover, I would like to think of the pain of natural disasters: lives and livelihoods destroyed in raging and recent floods in our Country. As I reflect on these experiences, I am reminded of "the time of great distress" in the second reading from the Book of Revelation. John tells

us that the people gathered in God's presence are those "who have survived the time of great distress."

John's vision of the multitude of people before God's throne reveals God's desire for us. God desires to satisfy our hunger and quench our thirst; God wants to protect us from anything that would hurt us. As you read these words, I invite you to reflect: Where is your pain? What hurts are you carrying in your life? What brings you tears? Your

pain, hurt, or tears are not alien to God. Like the Good Shepherd in today's Gospel, who knows every sheep by name, God knows your pain, feels your hurt and sees your tears. For your pain God promises new life; for your hurts God promises healing, and for your tears God promises consolation. But one thing you have to do is surrender them to the Lord. When the offertory procession beings, spiritually handover all that disturbing in your heart and mind. Mingle yourself with the bread and wine, spiritually pour yourself and your family, then this Sacrifice of our Lord becomes whole.

Jesus, the Good Shepherd, desires to shepherd us beyond our tears, beyond our hurts, from death unto life, from darkness unto light. The Good Shepherd gives us each day as a time of grace—a time to thrive rather than simply survive—because we are inheritors of God's grace. God clothes us in robes of consolation, garments of comfort, and cloaks of healing. In times of distress, God leads us tenderly to springs of living water. As you read these sentences and words are actualized in you and you become the peace and consolation to others to

spread the love of Jesus to this Universe. Let us become mirrors of compassion to others, like our Lord.

May I wish God's richest blessings upon the women of All Saints' Parish as you celebrate this Mothers' Day. May you be honoured and cherished for the blessing you are to your family and this community.

First Reading Acts 13:14, 43-52

Paul and Barnabas carried on from Perga till they reached Antioch in Pisidia. Here they went to synagogue on the sabbath and took their seats.

When the meeting broke up, many Jews and devout converts joined Paul and Barnabas, and in their talks with them Paul and Barnabas urged them to remain faithful to the grace God had given them.

The next sabbath almost the whole town assembled to hear the word of God. When they saw the crowds, the Jews, prompted by jealousy, used blasphemies and contradicted everything Paul said. Then Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly, 'We had to proclaim the word of God to you first, but since you have rejected it, since you do not think yourselves worthy of eternal life, we must turn to the pagans. For this is what the Lord commanded us to do when he said:

I have made you a light for the nations,

so that my salvation may reach the ends of the earth.

It made the pagans very happy to hear this and they thanked the Lord for his message; all who were destined for eternal life became believers. Thus the word of the Lord spread through the whole countryside.

But the Jews worked upon some of the devout women of the upper classes and the leading men of the city and persuaded them to turn against Paul and Barnabas and expel them from their territory. So they shook the dust from their feet in defiance and went off to Iconium; but the disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.

Rv 7:9, 14-17

I, John, saw a huge number, impossible to count, of people from every nation, race, tribe and language; they were standing in front of the throne and in front of the Lamb. dressed in white robes and holding palms in their hands. One of the elders said to me, 'These are the people who have been through the great persecution, and because they have washed their robes white again in the blood of the Lamb, they now stand in front of God's throne and serve him day and night in his sanctuary; and the One who sits on the throne will spread his tent over them. They will never hunger or thirst again; neither the sun nor scorching wind will ever plague them, because the Lamb who is at the throne will be their shepherd and will lead them to springs of living water; and God will

wipe away all tears from their eyes.'
