Happy Feast and Blessings of this beautiful Birthday of the Church,

When God created man, he breathed into his nostril the Breath of Life. At Pentecost, the Breath of Life was breathed into the new people of God which we call "birth of the church." The Holy Spirit, who is responsible for the incarnation and birth of Jesus, is also responsible for the birth of the church. Jesus began his ministry, "Spirit-filled" (Mark 1:10), and so does the church. We are called to serve; the demand of our Baptism is Christian Service. We may Serve the Lord in any capacity, especially in proclaiming the Gospel, in the Hospital in the Nursing Home, or elsewhere in our Parish; all this needs complete trust in the Spirit. There will be little progress made without relying on the power of the Holy Spirit. We have ample evidence of this throughout the history of salvation. 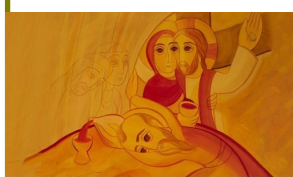

# READINGS—PENTECOST SUNDAY

## First Reading

**Acts 2:1-11**

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

## Second Reading

**1 Cor 12:3-7, 12-13**

A reading from the first letter of No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord' unless he is under the influence of the Holy Spirit.

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose.

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit it was given to us all to drink.
