FROM FR JOSEPH

A question to ponder from today's Gospel of Luke is would we pray if we didn't pray for our needs? Do we often think that God does not answer our prayer? Like the Israelites and the widow in today's Gospel, we too may face opposition and injustice, sometimes from what we perceive as godless and relentless opponents. In today's parable, justice comes from an unrighteous judge's unlikely source. Jesus is presenting God as a God of justice who prevails even over unjust people and institutions. We see the widow's faith and persistence are rewarded, even when her efforts may have seemed futile. Amidst the increasing



levels of chronic stress and burnout prevalent in our society, the Gospel point us to the ways that God hears and responds to us in prayer. Jesus is presenting God as a God of justice who prevails even over unjust people and institutions.

Amidst the increasing levels of chronic stress and burnout prevalent in our society today, the Gospel points us to the ways that God hears and responds to the cries of the most vulnerable. We need to consider that it is better to pray not just for what we need, but above all for a life so filled with God that we forget what we prayed for. This way we will learn to pray often, forming good prayer habits.

strength that I might achieve; He made me weak that I might obey. I asked for health that I might do greater things; I was given grace that I might do better things. I asked for riches that I might be happy; I was given poverty that I might be wise. I asked for power that I might have the praise of men; I was given weakness that I might feel the need of God. I asked for all things that I might enjoy life; I was given life that I might enjoy all things. I received nothing that I asked for, all that I hoped for. My prayer was answered, I was most blessed."

READINGS—29th Sunday Ordinary Time Year C

First Reading

Exodus 17:8-13

The Amalekites came and attacked Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua, 'Pick out men for yourself, and tomorrow morning march out to engage Amalek. I, meanwhile, will stand on the hilltop, the staff of God in my hand.' Joshua did as Moses told him and marched out to engage Amalek, while Moses and Aaron and Hur went up to the top of the hill. As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage; when he let his arms fall, the advantage went to Amalek. But Moses arms grew heavy, so they took a stone and put it under him and on this he sat. Aaron and Hur supporting his arms, one on one side, one on the other; and his arms remained firm till sunset. With the edge of the sword Joshua cut down Amalek and his people.

Second Reading

2 Timothy 3:14 - 4:2

You must keep to what you have been taught and know to be true; remember who your teachers were, and how, ever since you were a child, you have known the holy scriptures – from these you can learn the wisdom that leads to salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All scripture is inspired by God and can profitably be used for teaching, for refuting error, for guiding people's lives and teaching them to be holy. This is how the man who is dedicated to God becomes fully equipped and ready for any good work.

Before God and before Christ Jesus who is to be judge of the living and the dead, I put this duty to you, in the name of his Appearing and of his kingdom: proclaim the message and, welcome or unwelcome, insist on it. Refute falsehood, correct error, call to obedience – but do all with patience and with the intention of teaching.

Luke 18:1-8

Jesus told his disciples a parable about the need to pray continually and never lose heart. 'There was a judge in a certain town' he said 'who had neither fear of God nor respect for man. In the same town there was a widow who kept on coming to him and saying, "I want justice from you against my enemy!" For a long time he refused, but at last he said to himself, "Maybe I have neither fear of God nor respect for man, but since she keeps pestering me I must give this

widow her just rights, or she will persist in coming and worry me to death."

And the Lord said, 'You notice what the unjust judge has to say? Now will not God see justice done to his chosen who cry to him day and night even when he delays to help them? I promise you, he will see justice done to them, and done speedily. But when the Son of Man comes, will he find any faith on earth?'

Apostles' Creed
